CVB is presently seeking funding options to initiate a canoe tradition program along with the Chuuk Division of Commerce and Industry under Chief Peter Aten.

MICRONESIA TOURISM STUDY TEAM EYE-BALLS CHUUK SITES



From February 28 to March 4, Mrs. Jennifer Davey and Ms. Josephine Chong from Horwath HTL Australia visited Chuuk. The team is on a mission to assess the tourism sector throughout Micronesia so as to determine specific assistance pathways that the ADB may prioritize and pursue for socioeconomic assistance through tourism investment.

While in Chuuk, the team met with hotel operators, liveaboard boats, pubic officials, the tourism office, and businesses. At the end of their

study trip, they will compile their recommendations through a report. According to an online report by the bank:

To date, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has committed 66 public sector loans, grants, and technical assistance totaling \$187.8 million to the FSM. Cumulative loan and grant disbursements to the FSM amount to \$98.4 million. These were financed by regular and concessional ordinary capital resources, and the Asian Development Fund, and other special funds. ADB's ongoing sovereign portfolio in the FSM includes 2 loans and 9 grants worth \$75.3 million.

FSM FOOD SECURITY WORKSHOP BRINGS TOGETHER MULTI-SECTOR PARTICIPANTS IN CHUUK



On February 27, the FSM Food Security Project Coordinator, Mr. Mark Kostka and Communication Officer, Ms. Luan Lavern Gilmete, along with Mrs. Menoleen Jacob, Assistant Secretary at the FSM Department of Resources and Development, held a day-long workshop for Chuuk stakeholders at the L5 Conference room. Some Chuuk farmers, market owners, members of the business sector, NGOs, department staff, and key government agencies relating to the production sector took time to attend the meeting. One key recommendation by the Food Security Project team is for farmers and policy makers to form the mechanism for farmers to unite and coordinate efforts through a united body. The Food Security Project has been hailed a game-changer for Climate-Smart Farming in FSM, targeting to assist some 9,000 farmers through a grant sourced by the Green Climate Fund and being managed by the Micronesia Conservation Trust (MCT).
